
Poltergeists By, Alex Dake

Neighbors swear they saw madam Lalaurie chasing a slave girl across the roof. The girl to scared to face the whip jumped to her death. In 1834 a fire broke out. In the attic they saw a hidden room with terribly tortured slaves, bones and limbs thrown on the floor. There were many bodies under the floorboard and some were later found long after Madathe m Lalaurie fled to France. The house is currently occupied by the spirits of the slaves.

ARE GHOSTS REAL?




